If it is difficult or impossible for you to afford drug co-pays or your health insurance monthly payments, you may be eligible for assistance from The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS).

## Who Is Eligible?

To be eligible for this program:

- The patient's household income is at or within five times the U.S. Federal Poverty Level\*
- The patient has health insurance coverage, such as:
  - Private Health Insurance
  - Medicare Plan B or D
  - Medicare Supplementary Health Insurance
  - Medicare Advantage
- Funds are available for certain types of leukemia, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, Hodgkin lymphoma, myeloma and myelodysplastic syndromes.

Eligibility is subject to change. Visit [www.LLS.org/copay](http://www.LLS.org/copay) or call 877.LLS.COPAY to get the most current list of available co-pay assistance funds.

## What Information Will Patients Need to Provide?

- > A completed application that is available online at [www.LLS.org/copay](http://www.LLS.org/copay) \*\*
- > A diagnosis and disease form, available online, completed and signed by their doctor, that confirms a blood cancer diagnosis and lists prescribed medications \*\*
- > Copies of their last federal income tax return, W-2 or other proof of income

Once the application and required documents are received, they will be processed by LLS in 10 to 20 business days.

\*\* Patients who do not have access to a computer can call (877) LLS-COPAY and LLS staff will mail or fax forms to them.

## Who Will Receive the Payment?

- > In most cases, the payment will be sent directly to the local pharmacy, hospital, doctor, insurance provider or, less commonly, directly to the patient.
- > Payment amounts may be adjusted based on availability of LLS's co-pay funds for the disease being treated and the volume of patients being served by the program. If a patient is determined to be eligible and funds are not immediately available, the patient will be placed on a waiting list pending the receipt of additional funds.

## What If a Patient Changes Doctors or Pharmacies?

Patients enrolled in this program have complete freedom to choose doctors, providers, suppliers, insurance companies and treatment medications. Patients are free at any time to make changes in any of the above without affecting their continued eligibility for the co-pay assistance program.
